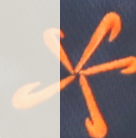

The choices you make should be based on interest, ability and future career aspirations.

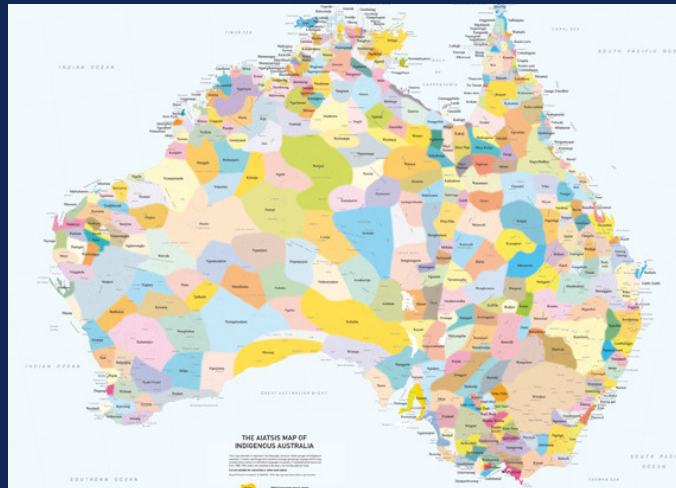

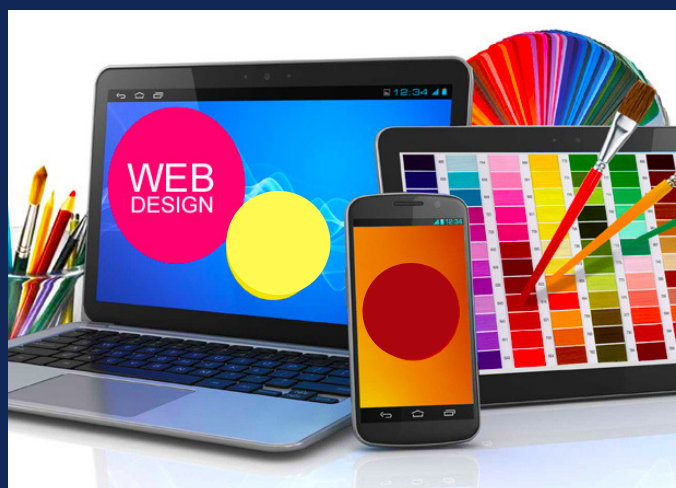
