


Chifley College Shalvey Campus

NAIDOC Week Celebrations

At Chifley College Shalvey Campus we acknowledge and pay our respects to the Darug people – the traditional custodians of the land we are teaching and learning on each day.

Throughout the week, our Aboriginal students contributed to our new garden artwork that symbolises this year's NAIDOC Week theme "Always Was, Always Will Be".

Students participated in a classroom lesson that focused on the history and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Following this, our lunchtime NAIDOC 'Feastival' kicked off with an Acknowledgement of Country and a performance of traditional Aboriginal dances. All students were then invited to sample crocodile, emu, kangaroo and a traditional BBQ, as well as beautiful damper, native jams and cocky joy cream.

We are committed to increasing knowledge and understanding of the histories, cultures and experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and would like to thank all students for the pride and respect they showed throughout NAIDOC Week.



Dame Marie Bashir Peace Award

Careers with Mr K!

It's been a big year for our Stage 5 students, career wise, thanks to the work of our fantastic Careers Adviser, Mr Koutsonikolis.

This year, all Year 10 students had a Careers lesson each week. The lessons were based on maximising opportunities for post school options.

The new Careers Hub in the library was used for regular consultations such as TAFE enrolments, post-school options, subject selections for senior studies, supporting part-time employment and finding work experience for students in Year 9 and 10.

Despite many restrictions this year, there have been so many fantastic achievements in Careers in 2020:

- Creating Chances presented a 10-week program to Year 10 students focusing on resilience, self-confidence and planning for the future
- In addition, 20 Year 10 students participated in the Creating Chances "Gamechangers" entrepreneurial program and 15 Year 9 students took part in the 'Rugby in the Park' program where they spent time at Noumea Public School coaching their students
- Stage 5 Life Skills students completed the Foundation Skills for Vocational Pathways course





- 12 students completed work experience in Term 4 with 1 student gaining an apprenticeship in Sign Writing commencing in 2021
- 22 students completed their White Card course, ready for work in the Construction industry
- 29 students completed a Youth Engagement Strategy (YES) program at Mt Druitt TAFE in courses such as Hair and Beauty, Games Design, Forensic Science, Animal Care, Automotive, Plumbing and Café Skills
- 2 students completed Stage 5 Certificate 1 courses in Hospitality and Automotive at Mt Druitt TAFE
- 12 students toured the Productivity Bootcamp site at Nirimba TAFE to learn more about pre-apprenticeship pathways
- 3 students in Year 9 are currently engaged in the Western Sydney University (WSU) Fast Forward mentoring program

Thank you to Mr K for his incredible work throughout 2020. Well done to our students who completed training and certifications, as well as those who have shown dedication and commitment to work experience opportunities.

We wish our Year 10 students all the best for life after CCSC.




























Shalvey Campus Clontarf Academy
